





ACTIVITY

Groupwork: speaking

AIM

To compare the features and performance of three products (cars) and choose the best.

GRAMMAR AND FUNCTIONS

Comparative and superlative adjectives: -er, -est, more than, the most

Have got and there is/are Question words How much? How many?

VOCABULARY

Adjectives: comfortable, expensive, cheap, economical, good, bad (better, worse), high, low Features of a car: alarm, carphone, airbag, power steering, catalytic converter

PREPARATION

Make one copy of the text at the top of the worksheet for each student in the class. Cut out the sections as indicated and divide equally between groups of three students.

TIME

30 minutes

PROCEDURE

Elicit from the students features of a car that determine a) its economy, b) its comfort, c) its environmental friendliness, and d) its safety.

- **2** Give each student a copy of the text at the top of the worksheet and ask them to read it. Tell them that they are going to choose a car for the company's salespeople.
- Discuss with the whole class what qualities are going to be important.
- Ask the students to work in groups of three, Student A, Student B and Student C. Give each student the appropriate part of the worksheet.
- 5 Tell the students that they have information on one of the cars. Explain that they must ask and answer questions about the features of the other two cars with other students in their group. As they do this, they should fill in the table.
- When they have finished, ask the groups to make comparisons between the three cars. For example:

The Toida Dart is the most economical. The Lynx is a little more expensive than the Toida Dart.

7 Ask students to choose which one is best for the company to buy and then to report their decision to the rest of the class, giving reasons for their choice.

PAIRWORK OPTION

Use only the Student A and Student B parts of the worksheet and ask the students to compare and then choose between these two cars (the Lynx and the Commodore 200Si).

FOLLOW-UP

Either ask students to talk about and compare rival products in a market they know well, or ask them to comment on these three types of company and say which they would prefer: a large multinational, a small family business, a charity.
