Aim

To practice using superlatives.

Time

20-25 minutes

Skills

Preparation

Photocopy the worksheets. Make sure there is one for each student in the class.

Procedure

- 1 Give each student a worksheet.
- 2 Explain the task for the first part of the activity. Students read the sentences and fill out the *You* column with their personal opinions.
- 3 Set a time limit of about five minutes. Ask students to complete the task individually.
- 4 When the time is up, explain the task for the second part of the activity. Students stand up and move around the room, interviewing three students and filling out the columns 1, 2 and 3 with the answers they receive. Students could put a check if other students agree with them and a cross if other students disagree. If a student agrees with them, they should also add their name or initials. The objective of the activity is for students to find someone who agrees with most of their opinions.
- 5 Set a time limit of ten minutes. Ask students to start the second part of the activity and move around the room to give help if needed.
- 6 When the time is up invite individual students to report their conclusions to the class.

Option

Instead of working with the whole class in the second part of the activity, students could be divided into groups of four. Their task would be to find someone in the group who agrees with most of their opinions.

Additional ideas

Do a class survey to find out which items most of the class agree about and which items most of the class disagree about.
