To practice the second conditional.

Preparation

Photocopy a set of cards and cut them up. One set should be enough if you can divide your class into four groups (see Procedure).

Procedure

- Divide the class into four groups of up to six or seven students. If you have more than 28 students, you may wish to create five or six smaller groups. In this case you will need an extra set of cards. Two groups will have to work on the same topic.
- 2 Explain that each group has a fantasy and they must convince the rest of the class that theirs is the most exciting one.
- 3 Hand out one card to each group. Give students time to read the cards. Explain that they can make notes of any extra ideas they have. Encourage them to give one or two examples to illustrate their arguments.
- 4 Move around the classroom listening and helping where necessary.
- 5 Have each group talk about their fantasy for three minutes.
- 6 After each group speaks, the others may ask questions.
- 7 At the end take a vote to decide which is the most exciting fantasy.

Additional ideas

A writing task could be based on what a student would do if one of the fantasies came true.
