ACTIVITY

Groupwork: reading, speaking

AIM

To describe an accident in the past and talk about its causes.

GRAMMAR AND FUNCTIONS

Past continuous and past simple to describe actions leading up to an event in the past.

Should for recommendations

VOCABULARY

Health: a pain, safety gloves, to lose consciousness, to be alive, ill, a risk

General: to search for, to get worse, to install, to involve, to spend time

PREPARATION

Make one copy of the table for each student in the class. Cut out the four sections as indicated for each group of two to four students in the class. Each student should have a description of a different accident or problem.

TIME

30 minutes

PROCEDURE

- Introduce the subject of safety at work by asking students what kind of health risks there are in different places of work such as a factory, an office, a building site etc.
- Explain that they are going to read about an accident or a problem at work and the events leading up to it.
- **3** Give each student the table and one of the descriptions.
- Ask students to read their description and to complete the table. They should not yet fill in the 'Recommendations' section.
- Ask the students to work in groups of two, three or four to find out about the other accidents or problems from other students in their group. Elicit the questions the students will need to ask.

For example:

What happened to Vanessa? How did that happen? What was she doing at the time?

- Tell the students to fill in the details on the table as they find out the information.
- When they have finished, ask students to discuss in their groups how this kind of accident/problem can be avoided. For example:

You should always follow safety procedures. Ask students to note down their ideas under 'Recommendations'.

When they have done this, go through the recommendations with the whole class.

FOLLOW-UP

Ask the students to write a description of an accident or a problem they know about or have experienced. They should ask the group to comment and to make recommendations.

ANSWERS

1	Typist	sharp pain in hand	typing for 5-6 hours a day
2	Electrical engineer	nearly electrocuted	not wearing safety gloves
3	Storeman	hit by two heavy boxes	overcrowded warehouse; boxes piled too high
4	Secretary	lost consciousness	stress due to overwork
