## Don't forget your toothbrush

#### Level 2 • Beginner-Elementary

Age: Primary (6-11)

**Language aims:** To practise using o'clock; to practise describing actions related to holidays; to practise using verbs

Time: 40 minutes

Student grouping: Pairs, whole class

**Materials:** One copy of the worksheet per student; the audio (downloaded in advance or played via onestopenglish); realia or pictures of a car, toothbrush, rocks, socks and a suitcase; a clock with moving hands or 12 large clock faces, each marked with a different o'clock, e.g. 1 o'clock, 2 o'clock, etc

Language focus: Mum, dad, baby, granny; car, toothbrush, rocks, socks, everything, suitcase, holiday; sleep, wait, cry, scream, pack; It's time to, don't forget, full of; Mr Wolf

### **Procedure**

#### Step 1

Teach car, toothbrush, rocks, socks and suitcase using realia or pictures. Teach sleep, wait, cry, scream, pack and forget through mime.

#### Step 2

Teach don't with the some verbs, for example Don't cry, Don't forget ...

#### Step 3

Hand out the worksheets. Introduce mum, dad, baby and granny.

#### Step 4

Explain you are going to teach the class a chant. Ask the children to listen and identify where the family are going on holiday (granny's) and what happens to the baby. (He changes from sleeping to crying to screaming!)

#### Step 5

Play the audio a few times and let the children say the chant, copying the actions that you demonstrate at the front.

#### Step 6

Brainstorm with the class things they sometimes do on holiday or when preparing for a holiday, for example fly a kite, go fishing, buy tickets, lock the house, walk the dog, read a book. Write and draw these actions on the board. Ask the whole class 'What time is it?' Then ask a volunteer to choose an action from the board and say, for example, 'It's time to walk the dog'. The rest of the class then have to mime It's time to walk the dog. Tick the action walk the dog on the board so it is not used again. Repeat with other actions and children.

### Follow-up activity

Use the classroom clock or paper clocks to practise saying the time. Do this in an entertaining way, for example by playing What's the time, Mr Wolf? with two children and a 'wolf' at the front of the class. Ask 'What's the time, Mr Wolf?' and hold up the 'o'clock' time. The class have to say the time together, for example, 'It's four o'clock' and the children take the same number of steps (four, in this case) towards the wolf. Whenever he likes, the wolf can decide to try and eat the children. He says 'Yes, It's four o'clock and it's time to eat you!' and runs at the two children. If he catches one of them before they sit down, they have to be the next wolf. Now choose two other children to creep up on the wolf.


