ACTIVITY

Groupwork: speaking

AIM

To discuss possible solutions to a problem and to consider the possible consequences.

GRAMMAR AND FUNCTIONS

Second conditional

VOCABULARY

General: to withdraw (a product), to inherit, to keep (something) secret, a year off, promotion

PREPARATION

Make one copy of the worksheet for each student in the class.

TIME

30 minutes

PROCEDURE

- 1 Give one copy of the worksheet to each student and focus their attention on the situations. Check they know the meaning of the new vocabulary.
- 2 Ask students to work in pairs or small groups to discuss the questions and to say what they would do in the various situations. They should ask each other to give reasons for their views.
- **3** Go through the answers with the whole class, encouraging students to comment on the decisions taken.

OPTION

- 1 Put students in pairs or groups.
- **2** Each student chooses one of the three options and defends the case for it (ie everyone in the group backs a different option).

FOLLOW-UP

Ask the students to think of other, similar situations for discussion and to be prepared to present these to the class and to say what they themselves would do.
