

Heavy syllable

Read these words aloud:

MONUMENT

CATHEDRAL




Both words have three syllables (MON/U/MENT, CA/THE/DRAL),

but the stress is different.

In MONUMENT, the stress is on the first syllable: the first syllable is 'heavier' than the other two. In CATHEDRAL, the stress is on the second syllable: the second syllable is 'heavier' than the other two.

Waiter! Your thumb is in my soup! - Don't worry, sir. It's not very hot.


Waiter! I'll have coffee without milk, please. — We haven't got any milk, sir. Would you like coffee without cream?


