

ACTIVITY

Groupwork: reading, speaking

AIM

To match up the first and second halves of a set of sentences.

GRAMMAR AND FUNCTIONS

Collocation of verbs and nouns

VOCABULARY

hold a meeting, make a phone call, give a speech, fix an appointment, meet a deadline, draw up a plan, present an argument, second a proposal, catch a plane, have a day off, invoice a client, write off a bad debt, make an offer, claim (£1m) in damages, raise capital, issue shares, reach a target, agree terms

PREPARATION

Make one copy of the worksheet for each group of four to six students and cut it up into cards as indicated. Each card carries the first or second half of a sentence. Keep the cards separate (first halves in one pile, and second halves in another pile) and mark the backs of each card to indicate which each one is. For example, mark each first-half card with a number 1 and each second-half card with a number 2.

TIME

10 minutes

PROCEDURE

- Divide the class into groups of four to six.
- 2 Give each group a set of cards and ask them to spread them on the table, face down.
- **3** Explain the objective of the task, which is to put the cards together in pairs to make 18 sensible sentences. Explain that students can see if a card is a first-half or a second-half by looking for a number 1 or 2 on the back of each card.
- Ask them to begin.
- 5 When the first couple of groups have finished, check the sentences with the whole class. If a group comes up with another solution in which all the sentences fit together logically, that's fine.

FOLLOW-UP

Ask the students to write new sentences using verb/noun combinations from the sentences on the cards. Check the sentences and then ask them to dictate them to each other in pairs.
