Time needed: 30-40 minutes (approx)

Preparation: Photocopy of the worksheet for

each student.

Lead-in (optional)

Ask students to look at the three pictures and guess what happens.

Pre-listening

- Ask students to read the three sentences and match each one to a picture.
- Put students in pairs and get them to discuss their answers together.
- 3 Explain that you will play the recording and they will check their answers.

While listening: Exercise 1

- Play the recording.
- 2 Get students to check their answers.
- Check the answers as a class.


Answer key:

1st picture – c) What's in your bucket? 2nd picture – a) The boys run away. 3rd picture – b) We have some magic oranges!

While listening: Exercise 2

- Tell the students you will play the recording and you want them to write down six or seven important key words.
- Tell students not to try and write down everything, but just the words they think are really important.
- Play the recording.
- Play the recording again and ask students to check they are happy with their choice of words.
- Dut students in pairs and get them to compare their words.
- Next, ask the pairs to try and reconstruct the text from their words – give them five or six minutes to do this.





- Pair the pairs to make groups of four and ask them to compare and improve their texts.
- Make groups of eight and repeat the process.
- Ask a few groups to read out their versions of the text.
- 10 Finally, play the recording a couple of times again (pausing every now and then) and get the students to check their versions against the original.

Note: This is a dictogloss. Do not expect your students to get a word for word version of the text – this isn't the idea. What you are looking for is a reasonable summary, or approximation, of the text.

Post listening

- 1 Ask students to look at the words and match the words in the left column with the words in the right column to make collocations.
- 2 Put students in pairs and have them check their ideas.
- Monitor and help where necessary.
- Check the answers as a class.

Note: There may be other collocations, i.e. *magic coins*.


