

## Festivals and Celebrations

### Independence Day

#### Teacher's Notes

Perhaps the most famous Independence Day in the month of July is that of the United States of America on July 4th, but many other countries also celebrate their independence in July. In the first activity your students will investigate Independence Day in the United States. In activities 2 and 3 they will discover which other countries celebrate an independence day at a similar time of year.

#### Activity 1: Timed Treasure Hunt

This treasure hunt introduces how this holiday is celebrated in the United States. Students search for the answers to the questions in various websites. They have 15 minutes to find the answers. When they finish, they can summarize (written or oral) the most common ways Independence Day is celebrated in the United States.

#### Answers:

1. The Declaration of Independence was adopted by the United States Congress to free America from British rule.
2. Thomas Jefferson.
3. Thomas McKean.
4. With military parades and cannon firing.
5. There are parades with baseball teams and high-school marching bands. Then people get together for a picnic or barbecue and in the evening fireworks displays are popular.
6. Over 300,000.
7. With a concert featuring the 1812 Overture with real cannons and a spectacular fireworks display.
8. It lasts 7 days and there are over 200 events.
9. 11.45 am sharp.
