

## Using the Yellow Pages

**Age Group:** Young Adults/ Adults

**Level:** Entry 3

**Time:** 1 hour (more if you opt to do the speaking practise)

**Skill focus:** Finding workers to repair your home.

**Sub skills:** Alphabetical order,

**Materials:** Worksheets, a copy of The Yellow Pages for each student.

**Curriculum References:** Rt/E3.7a (Scan Read) Rt/E3.5a (Locate Info)

1. Asks students if they have ever had any problems with the workings of their houses, such as leaks, broken pipes, smashed windows, faulty electrics. Ask them who repaired the problem. Open up a discussion about things that can go wrong in houses. You might like to give some anecdotal evidence about something that happened to you.
2. Students work through the first worksheet in preparation for using the yellow pages. They will need to be aware of the names of certain trades-people. Answers as follows:-

3. Students now fill in the worksheet as they look through the Yellow Pages or scan pages at [www.yell.co.uk](http://www.yell.co.uk). Make sure they are aware that it is in alphabetical order and that they can use the index to help them. Help students as they flick through the pages and have them compare answers with each other.
4. You might like to use the dialogue as a prompt for student dialogues, with one taking the role of the workman and the other the customer. You could also give them prompts for different problems.
