




In the nine squares of this grid there are some British coins and notes.

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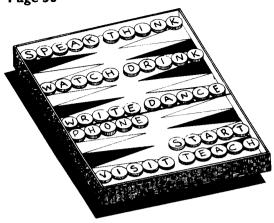

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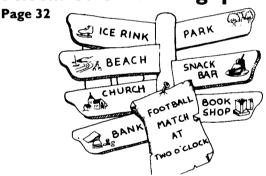

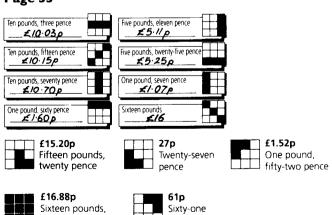
