In **BETWEEN**, the stress is on the second syllable: the second syllable is 'heavier'.

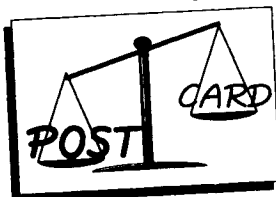
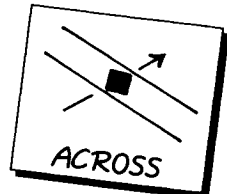
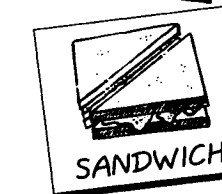
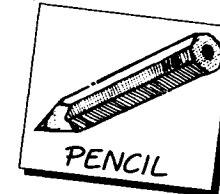
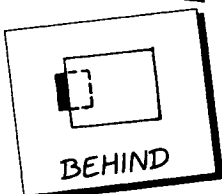
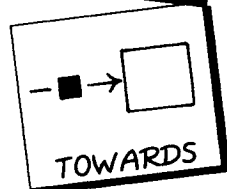
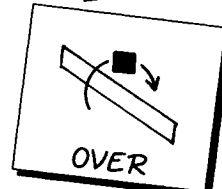
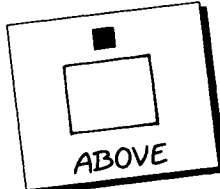
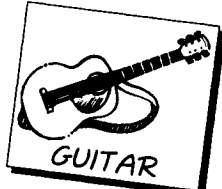
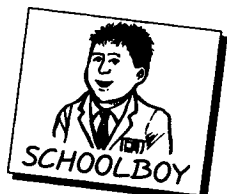
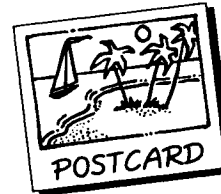

In the first group, 'greener', 'bigger' and 'higher' are all comparatives.

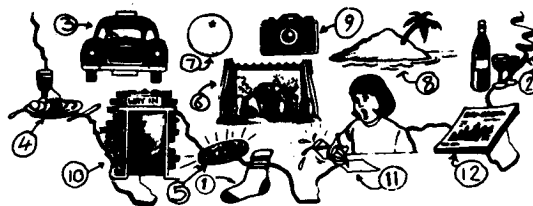
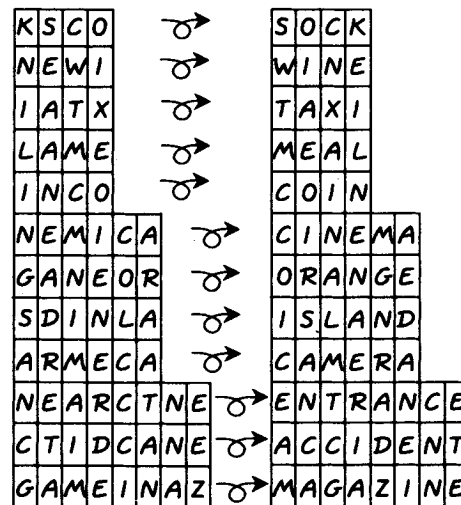
In the second group, 'singer', 'swimmer' and 'driver' all come from verbs ('sing', 'swim', 'drive').
