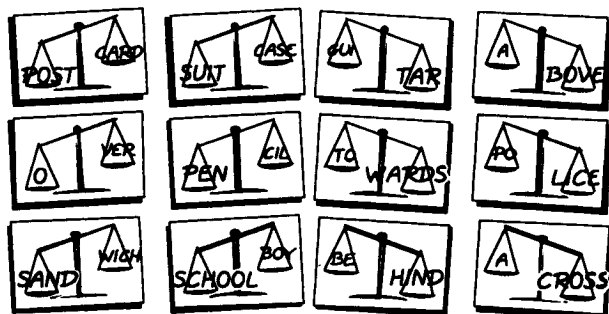

In the first group, 'greener', 'bigger' and 'higher' are all comparatives.

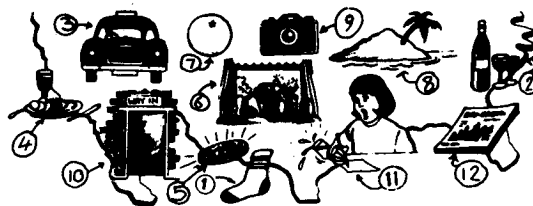
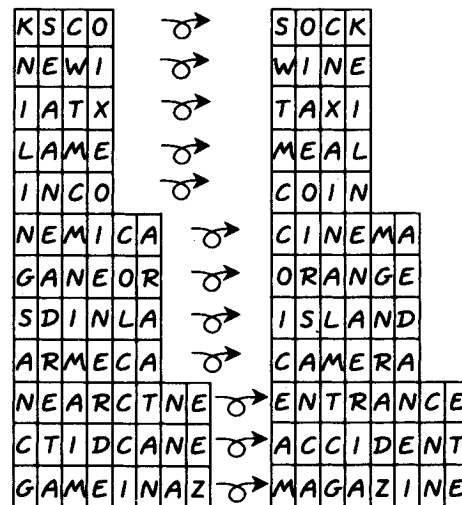
In the second group, 'singer', 'swimmer' and 'driver' all come from verbs ('sing', 'swim', 'drive').
