




To make their ing-form, most verbs just add ing (studying, spelling, starting, going, opening, telling, doing, eating, listening, working, helping).

Verbs ending with a consonant +e lose the e (leave leaving, take - taking, hope - hoping, skate - skating). Some verbs double the final consonant (get - getting, swim - swimming, run - running, stop - stopping).


