ACTIVITY

Pairwork: speaking

AIM

To talk about how long certain things have been established.

GRAMMAR AND FUNCTIONS

For and since with present perfect simple

VOCABULARY

General: the European Community, a public holiday, computer operating system, space programme, nuclear testing, world-wide, to be in power

PREPARATION

Make one copy of the worksheet for each student, and fold the worksheet as indicated.

TIME

15 minutes

PROCEDURE

- Tell the students that they are going to decide when certain important business and political events happened.
- Give one copy of the folded worksheet to each student and ask them to look at the top section. Ask them to work in pairs to match the dates in the box to the events. Encourage them to put sentences into the correct tense. For example:

I think May 1 has been a public holiday for nearly a 100 years.

If students have difficulty forming the present perfect from the prompts, ask them to write their answers in the space provided.

- 3 Check the answers with the whole class by asking students to read out their sentences.
- Ask the students to unfold the worksheet and look at the questions. Ask the students to work in pairs to ask and answer the questions, making a note of their partner's answers.
- Ask the students to report back their findings to the whole class. Is there any information they find particularly interesting or surprising?
