NOTE: Use Worksheets 1a and 1b for this activity.

ACTIVITY

Pairwork: reading, writing, speaking

AIM

To write and ask questions to obtain information in order to complete a life history.

GRAMMAR AND FUNCTIONS

Past simple Wh- questions

VOCABULARY

Life history

PREPARATION

Make one copy of Worksheets 1a and 1b for each pair of students in the class.

TIME

50 to 60 minutes

PROCEDURE

- 1. Tell the students that they are going to read some information about Stevie Wonder's life. Make sure the students know who Stevie Wonder is and that he is still very active, composing and performing in "humanitarian" concerts (fund-raising for social causes). Point out that there is some information missing from the text that you are going to give them.
- 2. Divide the students into Group A and Group B. Give one copy of Worksheet 1a to each student in Group A and one copy of Worksheet 1b to each student in Group B.
- 3. Ask the students to work with a partner from the same group for the first part of the activity. Explain that there are some details missing from their text and that they should write down the questions they need to ask to obtain the missing information. All the students must write the questions down in the spaces provided on their worksheet.

For example:

- Student A: 1. When was Stevie Wonder born?
 - 3. What did be do when be was young?
- Student B: 2. When Stevie Wonder was a small baby, what happened?
 - 4. What kind of singer was be by age 10?

While the students are doing this, be ready to answer questions and offer help.

- **4.** When the students have finished writing questions, ask them to work with a partner from the other group. Student A and Student B should now sit facing each other and take turns asking and answering questions in numerical order to find out the information missing from their own text. They should write the information in the blanks on their worksheet.
- 5. When they have finished exchanging information, the pairs of students compare their completed texts, which should be identical.
