

Animal Instinct Worksheet



ACTIVITY

Pairwork: writing, speaking

AIM

To pretend you are an animal and to give personal information as if you were that animal. To guess what animals other people are pretending to be.

GRAMMAR AND FUNCTIONS

Position of adverbs and adverb phrases

Adverbs of manner: well, badly

Adverb phrases of time: in the last/next few days, after dinner

VOCABULARY

Animals

PREPARATION

Make one copy of the worksheet for each student in the class.

TIME

15 to 20 minutes

PROCEDURE

1. Tell the students that you are going to talk to them from the point of view of an animal and that they should guess, from the information you give them, what the animal is. For example:

I live in Asia.

I fight well but I swim badly.

I hope to kill another animal to eat in the next few

I didn't enjoy being hunted in the last few days. I usually sleep after dinner.

My favorite place is in the jungle.

I'm beautiful, strong and dangerous.

(Answer: tiger)

- 2. Now give a copy of the worksheet to each student in the class.
- 3. Tell them to imagine that they are an animal and to write information on their worksheet from that animal's point of
- 4. Ask the students to work in pairs and take turns reading out their information to their partner. The partner must guess what the animal is.
- 5. Tell them to find a new partner and repeat procedure point 4.

FOLLOW-UP

- 1. Give the students another copy of the worksheet and ask them to fill it out with information about themselves without writing their names.
- 2. When they have done that, collect the worksheets, mix them up and pin them up around the classroom so that the students can read them and guess who wrote them.
