Kuni Hayashi works for Manebo Cosmetics.

ACTIVITY

Groupwork: speaking

MIA

To find missing information by asking about the routines of five working people.

GRAMMAR AND FUNCTIONS

Present simple statements and questions (especially third person singular)

Adverbs of frequency Talking about routines

VOCABULARY

Means of transport Company and job titles

PREPARATION

Make one copy for each student of Worksheet 2a (table) and one copy of Worksheet 2b (sentences) for every group of six students in the class. Cut out the sentences into six cards as indicated.

TIME

25 minutes

PROCEDURE

Give the table to each student and elicit the correct question from each prompt. For example,

> Job: What does Kuni Hayashi do? Travel time to work: How long does it take Chantal Guerlain to get to work? etc

- Ask the students to work in groups of three or six. Give a different card or pair of cards to each student in the group.
- Ask the students to read their sentences and write in the table any definite information they now have and to write in the notes section information which they cannot yet place on the table.
- Ask students to mix with the other students in their group and ask each other questions in order to complete the table. Tell them to do it as quickly as they can but not to show their tables or sentences to the other members of the group. (It could be a race between groups if you wish.)
- When they have finished, go through the answers by asking students to give a profile of each person. For example: Kuni Hayashi is a salesman. He works for Manebo Cosmetics. He goes to work by train and it usually takes him...

PAIRWORK OPTION

Do the activity in the way described above, but ask the students to work in pairs, giving each student three cards. Allow extra time for the students to read and transfer their information in step 3.
