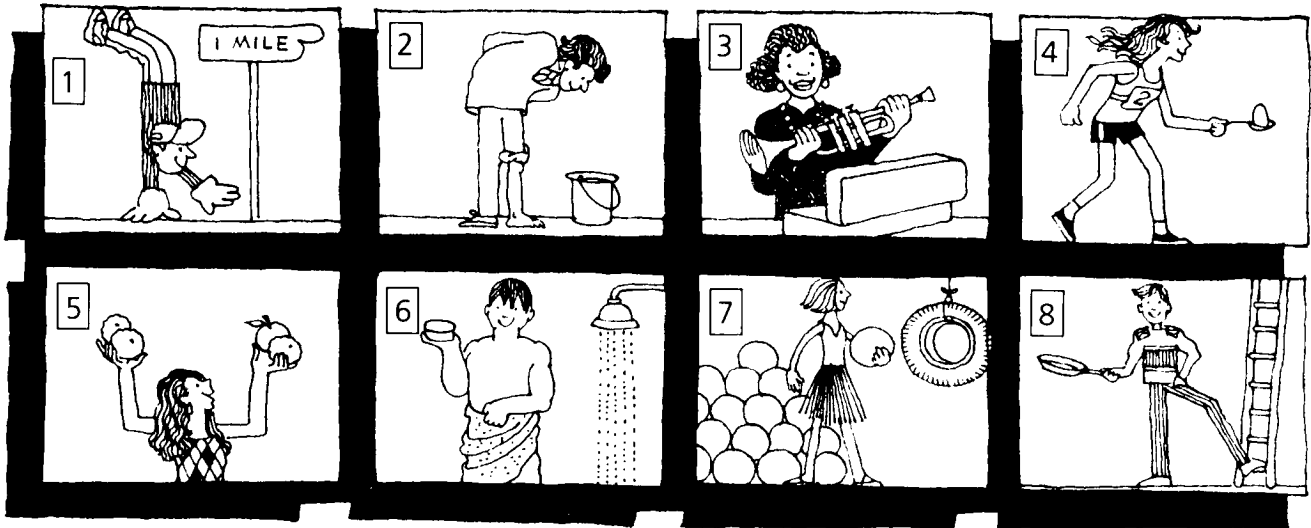


Unusual Activities

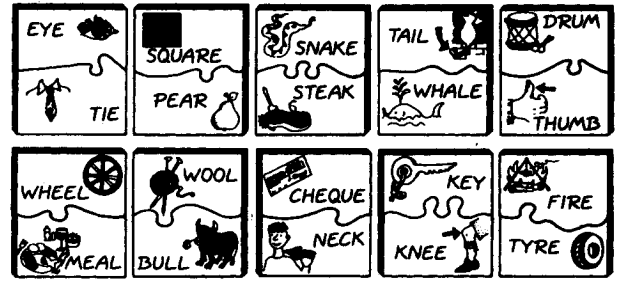

Note: The spellings 'cheque' and 'tyre' are British English. In American English, the spellings are 'check' and 'tire'.

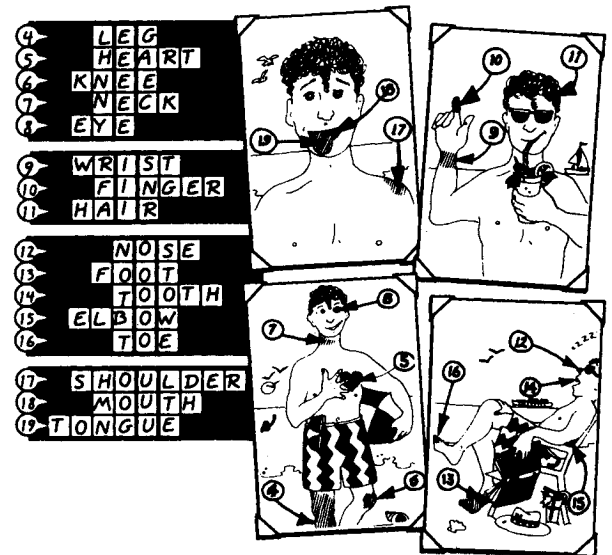
Sorry – I Can Explain!
