- 1 A British woman spent ten hours in the sea. She had a very lucky escape. 46-year-old Kay Longstaff fell from a cruise ship in the Adriatic Sea at midnight on 18 August, 2018. The ship was 60 miles (about 96 kilometres) from the coast. It was on its way to the Italian city of Venice when she fell into the water from the back of the ship.
- 2 Ms Longstaff was lucky because the weather was very good. The sea was calm and there were no waves. The temperature of the Adriatic Sea in the middle of summer is around 28 degrees Celsius, which is warmer than the water in a swimming pool. She is a good swimmer and was able to swim and float near to the place where she fell into the water.
- 3 A coastguard boat from the Croatian town of Cavtat and a plane began looking for Ms

- Longstaff at 6.30 the next morning. The ship's captain told the Croatian coastguard the exact place where she fell into the water so the rescuers were able to look for Ms Longstaff in the correct area.
- 4 More than three hours later, at 9.40, the Croatian coastguard saw Ms Longstaff in the water. A member of the coastguard jumped into the water and pulled her onto the coastguard boat. She was tired and cold but very happy to be alive. She told her rescuers that she stayed positive while she was in the water by singing songs.
- 5 It was a very lucky escape. Good weather and technology helped to save her. In cold water (for example, 10–16 degrees Celsius) and rough sea, people can only survive for an hour or two. In very cold water (0–4 degrees Celsius), people can survive for only about 30 minutes.
