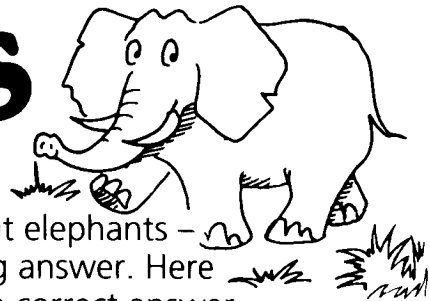


ELEPHANT JOKES



Elephant jokes are, of course, jokes about elephants – usually a strange question and an amusing answer. Here are seven of them. Join each question to the correct answer.

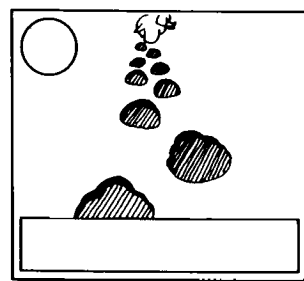
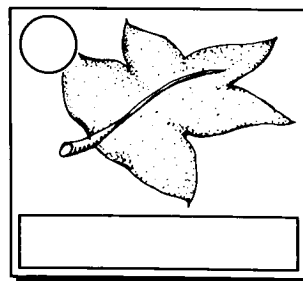
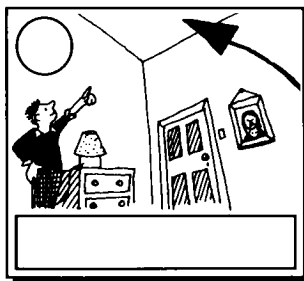
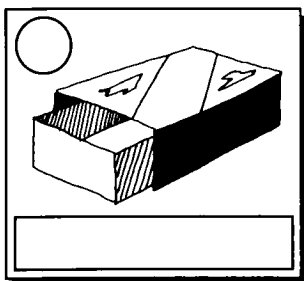
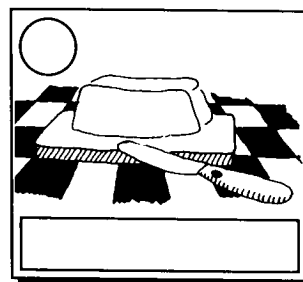
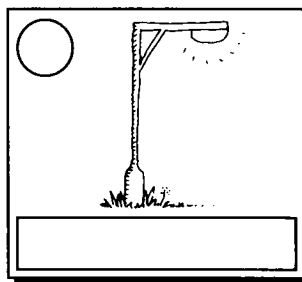
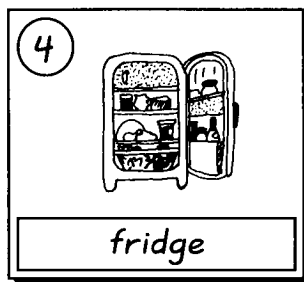
Questions

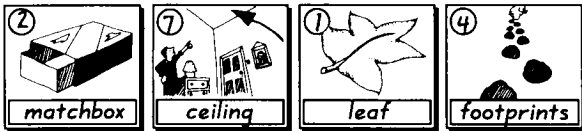
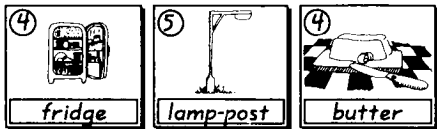

Elephant Jokes

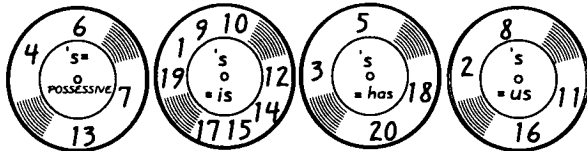
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- How does an elephant get down from a tree? – It sits on a leaf and waits for autumn.

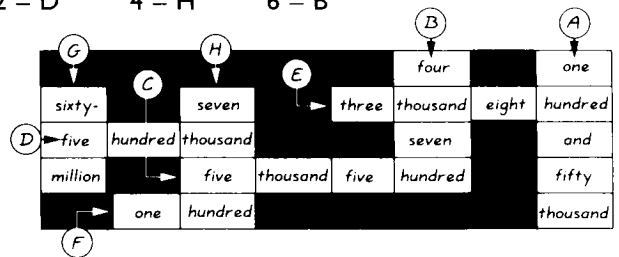
