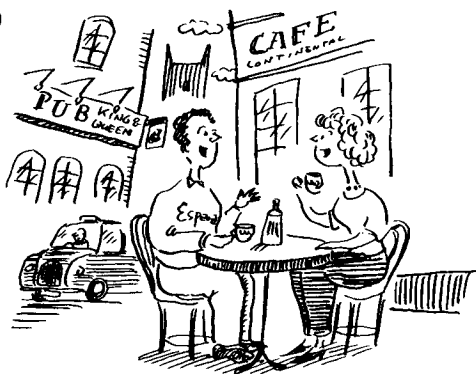


Present perfect and past simple 5
