ACTIVITY

Pairwork: speaking

AIM

To familiarise students with adjective-noun collocations commonly used in business.

VOCABULARY

General: decision, up-to-date, sharp, competitive

PREPARATION

Make one copy of the worksheet for each student in the class, and fold the worksheet as indicated.

TIME

30 minutes

PROCEDURE

- 1 Write the word *price* on the board and ask the students to suggest adjectives which could go with it. You are looking for *high*, *low*, *competitive*, *good*, but accept any reasonable answer (**not** *expensive* or *cheap*).
- 2 Give one worksheet folded so that they cannot see the questions at the bottom to each student and ask them to work in pairs to find as many adjective-noun combinations as possible for each noun on the list. Ask students to write in the possible adjectives in the space provided next to each noun.
- 3 Go through the answers with the whole class.
- 4 Ask the students to unfold their worksheets and read the questions. Ask the students to work alone to complete the section marked 'you'.
- 5 When they have done this, ask the students to work in pairs and ask and answer the questions with their partner. They should fill in the information in the section marked 'your partner' as they do so.
- **6** Discuss the answers with the whole class. Is there anything they found particularly interesting or surprising?

FOLLOW-UP

Students choose three or four collocations and make their own sentences or questions to present to the others.
