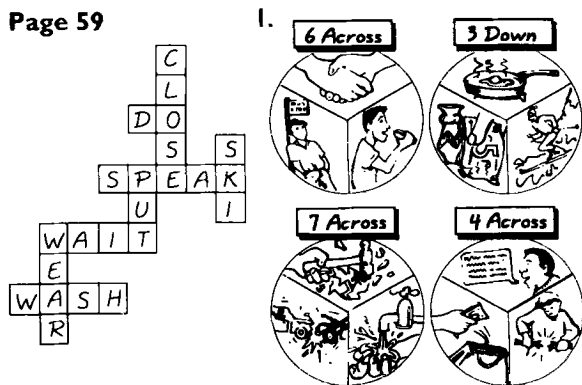
## Months Jigsaw

## Verb Mini-crossword

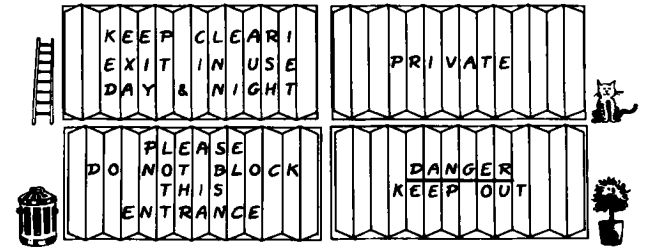

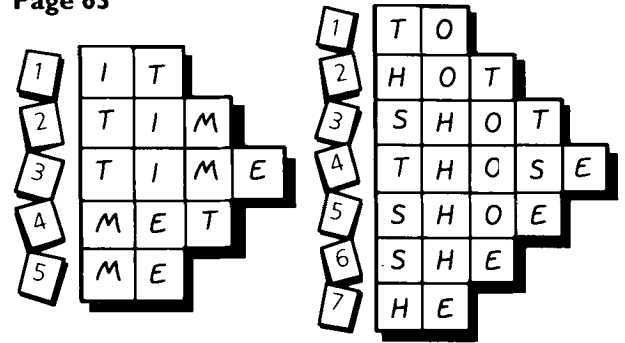

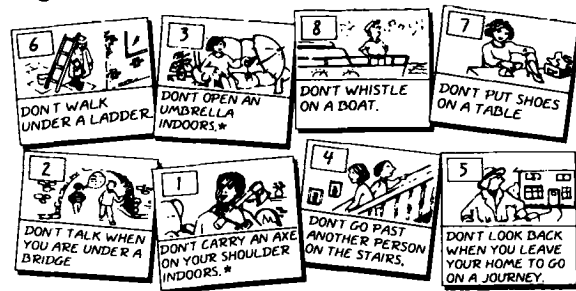
