Topic 1: History

Theories given: a local food fight among friends; an anti-Franco protest; started by bystanders at a carnival parade who began throwing tomatoes at their opponents; started by youngsters grabbing some tomatoes from a nearby vegetable stall and throwing them at a giant from a parade

Topic 2: The festival

- 1. Trucks deliver the tomatoes and the throwing beings at 11 am.
- 2. around 125,000 kg
- 3. local people and tourists
- 4. two hours
- 5. A siren sounds.
- 6. Water is pumped from a nearby Roman aqueduct.

Topic 3: Advice

- 1.
