ACTIVITY

Pairwork: speaking

AIM

To act out a conversation and then improvise another one.

GRAMMAR AND FUNCTIONS

Question tags

VOCABULARY

to be accused of, money laundering, gossip, smuggler, in cash, case (legal), in court

PREPARATION

Make one copy of the worksheet for each student in the class.

TIME

15-30 minutes

PROCEDURE

PART 1

- 1 Tell the students that they are going to practise question tags.
- **2** Explain that 'money laundering' is moving illegally-obtained money into legitimate bank accounts. Explain the 'laundering' metaphor.
- **3** Ask the students to work in pairs.
- **4** Give out the worksheets and ask them to complete the conversation with the correct question tags.
- 5 When they have finished, ask the students to act out the conversation. Circulate checking pronunciation. Ask them to swap around so that each one practises both sides of the conversation.

PART 2

- 1 Divide the class into two groups: directors and police officers. There should be twice as many police officers as directors.
- 2 Explain that the directors of INA are going to be interviewed by the police in connection with the accusations of money laundering.
- **3** Give them time to discuss so that the directors can prepare their case and the police officers their questions.
- 4 Put them in threes one director to two police officers and ask them to act out the interview.

FOLLOW-UP

Ask the students to work in pairs to play Tag - the rules are given below.

- 1 One student is Q, the other A.
- **2** Q asks questions using tags which will produce the answer *yes* from A (*You're an engineer, aren't you?*).
- **3** The questions must be about A's job and company.
- 4 A must tell the truth.
- 5 Every time A gives an affirmative answer, Q gets one point and can ask another question.
- **6** When A replies in the negative or Q repeats a question, the turn changes: A becomes Q and Q becomes A.
- 7 The winner is the one with the most points at the end of five minutes.
