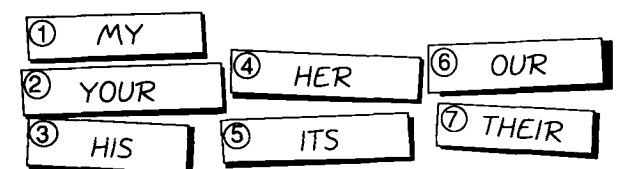
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- Charles Lindbergh (1902–1974) flew across the Atlantic in 1927, when he was twenty-five years old.

$$\boxed{12} + \boxed{02} = \boxed{07} + \boxed{07} \quad (14)$$

$$\boxed{17} + \boxed{24} = \boxed{20} + \boxed{21} \quad (41)$$

Note: The dates in numbers (e.g. 17.12.03) are in the British style: day, month, year. In the United States, a different order is used: month, day, year (e.g. 12.17.03).
