More than 80,000 fires are burning in the Amazon rainforest

- 1 The Amazon rainforest covers 5,500,000 square kilometres in nine countries of South America. Around 60% of the forest is in Brazil, 13% in Peru and 10% in Colombia. There are also smaller areas of the rainforest in Venezuela, Ecuador, Bolivia, Guyana, Suriname and French Guiana. It is the largest tropical rainforest in the world. It has more than 390 billion trees and thousands of different species of plants, insects, birds and animals.
- 2 The dry season in the Amazon usually lasts from the beginning of August until the end of November. In 2019, since the start of the dry season, there have been a large number of forest fires in the Amazon region. So far, there have been more than 80,000 fires in the Brazilian rainforest, and thousands of these are still

- burning. There are 77% more fires than in 2018. This is the largest number of fires since official records began in 2013.
- 3 Forest fires can be caused by natural events, particularly by lightning during thunderstorms. But experts believe that humans started most of the fires in the Amazon rainforest in 2019. This was mainly by farmers who clear the forest to make space to grow crops like soya or to make room for cattle farms. Some people believe that Jair Bolsonaro, who became president of Brazil in January 2019, is not doing enough to stop farmers burning trees. They say that he should do more to protect the rainforest.
- 4 President Bolsonaro has now sent 44,000 soldiers to the Amazon region, and world leaders at the G7 summit in France offered Brazil US \$22 million to help fight the fires. But it may be too little too late.


