1 The marathon is the longest race at the Olympic Games with a distance of 42.195 kilometres. The name comes from the legend of a man in Ancient Greece who ran from Marathon to Athens in 490 $B C$. He ran to take the news of a Greek victory in a battle against the Persians. The marathon race was run at the first modern Olympic Games in Athens in 1896, and now there are more than 800 marathon races around the world each year.

2 Now, a British man, 30-year-old Nick Butter from Bristol, has become the first person in the world to run a marathon in all 196 countries. A friend of his is very ill with cancer, so Nick decided to run 196 marathons in 196 countries to make money for a cancer charity.

3 He ran his first marathon in the snow in Canada in January, 2018, and finished in "the home of the marathon" in Athens on 10 November, 2019, 674 days after he started. He ran a total of 8,270 kilometres and used ten passports because he needed visas for a lot of the countries he ran in. He visited all seven continents, including Antarctica. He took 5.1 million steps during the 196 marathons and burnt 5.1 million calories.

4 Nick has made $£ 65,000$ for the cancer charity, but he wants to make $£ 250,000$ in total. He has completed his record-breaking 196 marathons, but he is not planning to stop running. He says he will continue to run one or two marathons every week. His next plan is to run over 1,300 kilometres around the coast of Iceland.
