- Cinco de Mayo festivities mostly take place in the US, in particular in cities in south-western states that have large Mexican-American populations such as Los Angeles, San Antonio, Phoenix, Albuquerque, Denver and El Paso. The fifth of May is not, as many people mistakenly believe, Independence Day in Mexico. That is on 16th September and is a national holiday in Mexico. Cinco de Mayo is not a national holiday in Mexico, nor in the US. In fact, apart from in the city of Puebla which stages a re-enactment of the battle, it's hardly celebrated in Mexico at all. It is primarily a celebration of Mexican culture and heritage and a time for music, dancing, partying and fiestas in the United States which has no other major celebrations in the month of May.
- Despite this, the origins of Cinco de Mayo go back to the unlikely victory over France in the Battle of Puebla on 5th May, 1862 when a group of 2000 loyal, poorly-supplied Mexicans, gathered from all over the country, defeated 6000 heavily-armed French troops during the second Franco-Mexican War (1861–1867). This became a symbolic victory for the Mexican government and greatly strengthened the resistance movement within Mexico.
- In the 1960s, at the time of the Civil Rights Movement in the US, Mexican-American activists started to use the fifth of May as a day to demonstrate pride in their Mexican heritage. In the late 1980s, importers of Mexican beers such as Modelo and Corona took advantage of this and introduced marketing campaigns that have been so successful that Americans now reportedly buy as much beer for Cinco de Mayo celebrations as they do to watch the Super Bowl or to celebrate St. Patrick's day. Many large Cinco de Mayo festivities have corporate sponsors and the celebration has become increasingly commercial. So much so, that it is sometimes criticised as being a 'fake holiday' created by drinks companies.
- Whether it involves beer, margaritas and tequila or not, most people in the US see Cinco de Mayo as a day to celebrate all things Mexican: the culture, the traditions and the achievements of people with a Mexican background who live in the US and have achieved fame, fortune and success. Schools, especially in the southern US states, use it as a fun opportunity to teach their pupils about their immediate neighbours from the south. There are parades, street parties, festive dress, mariachi music and folk dancing, and, of course, Mexican food such as tacos, tortillas, guacamole and mole poblano a thick sauce made from green chili peppers and chocolate and usually served over chicken a dish that originates in Puebla in Mexico.
