Which Medicine?


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- A has got a HEADACHE, so Number 4 is the best medicine.
- B has got a COLD, so Number 6 is the best medicine.
- C has got a TOOTHACHE, so Number 1 is the best
- D has got a STOMACHACHE, so Number 3 is the best medicine.
- E has got a COUGH, so Number 5 is the best medicine.
- F has got a BACKACHE, so Number 2 is the best medicine.

Remember: it is also possible to say 'toothache', 'stomachache' and 'backache' without 'a' ('l've got toothache', etc.).

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


Remember: the -ing form of 'dance' is 'dancing' (not 'danceing').

The song about the future is 'What are you doing Sunday?' (You can also say 'What are you doing on Sunday?')


A Chemical Code

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Crossword in Two Parts


