5 Job description


Match the jobs to the descriptions.

Aim

The aim of this activity is to find out how many of the words the students know. Put the students in pairs to find words that have similar or opposite meanings.

1) Answers:

Similar meanings:

friendly + affectionate (nice)

(friendly) + out-going + sociable kind + generous + caring

selfish + thoughtless

easygoing + good-tempered (patient)

Opposite meanings:

shy + out-going/sociable

bad-tempered + easygoing good-tempered (patient) nice

generous + mean

selfish/thoughtless + thoughtful (caring)

childish + mature

2) Put the students in pairs to match the words to the descriptions.

Answers:

- 3. easygoing/good-tempered
- 4. thoughtless
- 5. affectionate
- 6. childish

- 8. selfish

3) Ask the students to make the words negative.
