We usually follow a 'sequence of tenses' rule, which states that if the verb in the main clause is in the past, then the verb(s) in the subordinate clause(s) are also in the past. In reported speech, there is also the 'back shift' rule, which states that, when you report a comment, the tenses in the comment are moved 'back' one tense in this order: present simple or continuous > past simple or continuous > past perfect simple or continuous; present perfect > past perfect; will > would; may > might; can > could; must > had to.

- **B** 1 a *I realised that we are all alone.* (Emphasis: it is a general truth and still true.)
  - b When I was a kid, I thought the world was full of scary monsters. (All happened in the same period.)
  - c I hated it when her friends asked me what I did. (All happened in the same period.)
  - d I was only nineteen and I thought I'd already failed. (The perfect had failed specifies 'previousness'.)
