

Episode 5: The Internet café

The story so far:

Katie has found that Facebook is a great way to keep in touch with her friends back in the UK. After the incident with Rich and the news that Sal's going to marry him, she has lots to tell her friends about so she goes to her local Internet café.



Listening

1. Listen to the episode and then decide what Katie would write as her status on her Facebook page.

Language: Expressing enthusiasm

Language note:

Candy uses the following structures a lot:

- so + adjective (It's so great)
- totally + adjective (I'm totally bored)
- totally + verb phrase (I totally love it)

This is a very informal way of speaking, and is characteristic of some young people. Note that some people think that this way of speaking is very annoying!

3. Put so or *totally* into these sentences in the appropriate place. More than one answer may be possible.

- CANDY: You know, I just feel like I *totally* need to change my life. Do you know what I mean?
- KATIE: Yes, I suppose.
- CANDY: Anyway, and Mark is so sweet.
- KATIE: Mmm.
- MARK: Anyway, Katie. It's uh, it's good to see you again.
- KATIE: Thanks. Good luck. And good luck to you too ... Candy.
- CANDY: Thanks!
- MARK: I uh, I hope it all works out for you here in Los Angeles. With your new boyfriend.
- KATIE: Boyfriend?
- MARK: Rich. The, the guy that threw me out of the club.
- KATIE: What?
- MARK: I saw you and Rich kissing in the car park.
- KATIE: You ... He's ... He's not my boyfriend!
- MARK: Whatever. It's okay. I just hope you're happy. Goodbye Katie.
- CANDY: Goodbye. So nice to meet you.

KATIE: Yeah. Bye.

Teacher's notes
