

CPE (Certificate for Proficiency in English) Writing a summary

- Aim: To prepare students to write a 70 word summary (Use of English Part 5) and to learn how to keep to the word limit.
- Level: Specifically prepared for CPE exam but also useful for general written work and keeping down word limits.

Time: 45 minutes

Materials: none

Students work in groups of 2 to 3

Procedure

- 1. Ask students to have a discussion to find out about a subject they both have in common e.g. a film they both/all saw / a current affairs story they both/all heard about / a book they both/all read.
- 2. Once the subject has been established, ask students to discuss the subject and recall as much detail as possible about it.
- 3. Explain to students they have 10 minutes to write a summary of the chosen topic. Students should work as individuals.
- 4. Ask students to compare their summaries in their groups. Ask the following questions:
 - Which key points overlap within summaries?
 - How many words per summary were written, more or less?
 - Can you cross out any irrelevant information from the summaries, trying to narrow it down to 5 key points?
- 5. Explain to students they have 10 minutes to rewrite their summaries, individually. Explain they have five minutes to complete the task. They must focus on five key points only.
- 6. When students have finished, get them to compare their summaries again, and focus on the following questions:
 - Whose is the clearest? Why?





- What cohesive devices have been used?
- 7. After monitoring, teacher can give relevant input about:
 - cohesive devices
 - keeping the summary simple
 - explaining the reading component of this part of CPE
- 8. Follow up: Write the subjects chosen by all the groups on board. Ask students to mingle and read each others' summaries, commenting on:
 - key points chosen (for a reader who knows the subject)
 - simplicity (for reader who does not know the subject)
 - range of cohesive devices
