



Subject: Festivals

New Year

Introduction

January 1st is a public holiday in the UK and so there are many New Year's Eve parties. At midnight, people listen to the sound of Big Ben in London. Some people sing a song by the Scottish poet, Robbie Burns, about old friends – Auld Lang Syne. Many people make New Year's resolutions to start the New Year on a positive note.

Activity 1

 Read the phrases out loud and check understanding. Pupils label the pictures. • Ask What do you do for New Year? Point to the pictures and ask Do you do this? Pupils then tick the activities they do.

Answers: 1-eat grapes; 2-sing songs; 3-have supper; 4-make promises; 5-watch fireworks; 6-give presents

Activity 2

- Pupils circle the words to describe their New Year celebrations.
- Ask volunteers to read their sentences out loud.

Activity 3

- Ask What is your favourite New Year celebration?
- Pupils draw a picture and complete a sentence about their favourite New Year celebration.
