

Geography - Maps

TEACHER'S NOTES



Subject: Geography

Maps

Objective: locating items on maps **Vocabulary:** *swing, climbing frame, fountain, slide, path, bench*

Introduction

Some children might still be having difficulty distinguishing left and right. Locating items on a map and describing position help reinforce left-right discrimination.

Warm up

- Call out instructions to the class that involve left-right distinction *Turn to the left.* / *Raise your right hand.* / *Stand on your right leg.*
- Ask for volunteers to think of more instructions.

Activity 1

- Point to the pictures. Ask pupils to say where they would find these objects (*in a park*).
- Pupils match the words and pictures.

Answers: 1-c; 2-e; 3-b; 4-a; 5-f; 6-d

Activity 2

- Read the first sentence out loud. Pupils point to the place on the map.
- Repeat with the other sentences.
- Pupils draw the objects on the map.

Activity 3

- Make true / false sentences about the positioning of the objects with respect to the path, for example, *There are two fountains to the left of the path.* Pupils answer (*false*).
- Let volunteers make their own sentences.
- Pupils classify the words according to their position with respect to the path.

Answers: fountains-R; bench-R; swings -L; slide-R; climbing frame-L

Project ideas

- Pupils draw a street map of the area around the school or their home.
- Have a treasure hunt: pupils hide objects in the playground and write clues as to the location
