



countable and uncountable nouns, *there are more*... / *there is more* ...

Warm up

• Write the words from the word box on the board. Point to each word and ask: *Can I count (water)*? Pupils may find this quite difficult at first. Ask pupils to think about mass and groups of objects to help them.

Activity 1

• Pupils classify the words, then ask them to read each set of words out loud.

Answer key Things I can count: minerals, people, forests, roads, farms, factories; Things I can't count: wind, sunlight, water, coal, gas, petroleum

Activity 2

• Tell the pupils to look at the maps. Ask questions about the resources in each place, for example: *Is there any petroleum in Map A? Are there any forests in Map B? Which place has more coal?*

Answer key 1-There are more solar panels than windmills; 2-There is more sunshine than water; 3-There is less sunshine than petroleum; 4-There are more windmills than in map A; 5-There is less sunshine; 6-There is more water
