TEACHER'S NOTES

Guessing game: used to by Jill Hadfield



Level: Intermediate

Target age: Secondary / adult

Time needed: 20 minutes

Grammar objective: To practise *used to* in affirmative and negative sentences and questions

Materials: One worksheet for each student

Summary: An accuracy-based guessing activity for pairs of students to practise *I used to ..., Did you use to ...?* and *I didn't use to ...*

Procedure

- 1. Give each student a worksheet and put them in pairs.
- 2. Ask each pair to sit back-to-back or in a position where they cannot see what the other is writing.
- 3. Explain to the students that you want them to complete the worksheet as if they were their partner, guessing what their partner would write in each case.
- 4. When they have finished, they should ask questions to find out whether what they have written about each other is true, e.g.:
 Alicia: Miyuki, did you use to enjoy swimming?
 Miyuki: Yes! I used to go every Sunday!
- 5. When the students have finished asking and answering the questions, ask a few students to tell you the most interesting or funny thing they found out about their partner.
