Let's discuss

What is an online digital poster? **Extra information**

Creating an online poster allows you to include many different types of media, and also allows your poster to reach a wider audience. An online poster is an attractive way of explaining your topic with the use of images, videos, links, text, icons, music, etc. There are many free online tools that enable you to create an online digital poster to share with others.

Some online poster tools offer useful templates, as well as allowing you to use either your own images or those from the selection they provide.

Key

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- An online poster can contain images, videos, links, text, icons, music, etc.
- With an online poster you can reach a wider audience. Students' own answers.

Let's analyse

- A. Look at the example of an online poster. Answer the questions in groups.
- Students discuss the questions in groups of three or four. Elicit some answers and discuss as a class.

Poster tools
