
A Read the text and answer the questions.

A **poll** is a survey that gives a public opinion about a specific topic or question. Nowadays, many polls are online. With an online poll, your teacher can receive instant information or feedback from you and other students in their class. You can create polls to use on your computer, a smartphone, or tablet.

- 1. What was the last poll you did? What was it about?
- 2. Was the poll online, by phone, or on paper?

Poll: A questionnaire to find people's opinion. Pie chart: A circular chart with differently sized sectors. Bar chart: A chart with bars of different heights. Multiple choice: Listing different possible answers.

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Let's do it!

- **Step 1** Go online and search for a free poll-creating tool.
- Step 2 Decide if you are going to make a poll which gives a yes/no answer or a multiple-choice poll.
- Step 3 Choose a topic. Here are a few ideas:
 - Do you play a sport? Yes / No
 - Which sport do you prefer? Multiple choice list of sports
 - How often do you play ... ? Multiple choice list of adverbs of frequency: always / often / usually / sometimes / rarely / never
- Step 4 Think of a title for your project.
- Step 5 Create your poll and share it with your teacher and friends. Give them a time limit to answer your poll.
- Step 6 Share the link to your results with your teacher and classmates.
