# **Collaborative writing tools—Elementary**

#### Let's discuss

- A Read the text and answer the questions.
- Ask students to read the text and discuss the questions in pairs. Elicit some answers and discuss as a class.

## What is a collaborative writing tool?

A **collaborative writing tool** allows you to create written projects to collaborate and share easily with others online. These writing tools can help you to organize and improve your thoughts and ideas with other people's contributions.

Writing tools help you to create stories, letters, descriptions, opinions, notes, essays and any other kind of entries and projects. Some of them allow you to add photos and images to your work to make it more interesting.

#### Key

- 1 You can use a writing tool to create written projects to collaborate and share. You can also create stories, letters, etc.
- 2 Students' own answers.

- Ask students to look at the text and discuss the questions in small groups. Elicit some answers and discuss as a class.


#### Key

- Try making a group text using suggestions from the class. Ask students what sort of text they want to create and what information they want to include. Make the changes on screen.
