Let's discuss

What are digital stories? Extra information

Stories are the oldest form of education. Throughout history, people of all cultures have always felt compelled to tell stories. **Digital stories** are no different and could be the modern equivalent of pre-historic wall paintings.

Digital stories use online tools to animate or illustrate ideas. As the name implies, digital stories usually contain a mixture of images, text, recorded audio narration, video clips and/or music.

Most digital stories last between two and ten minutes and are told in an informal manner. A digital story is meant to communicate personal ideas about a topic or person.

- 1 They can contain images, text, recorded audio narration, video clips and music.
- **2** They normally last between two and ten minutes.

- Ask students to look at the digital story and discuss the questions in groups of three or four. Elicit some answers and discuss as a class.

- 1 Taylor Swift is an American singer and TV personality.
- 2 Students' own answers.
- 3 The digital story will tell us about Taylor Swift's childhood and life.
- 4 Students' own answers.
- Go online and type keywords to find websites for making digital stories. Show students how to find safe sites.
- Try making a group digital story using suggestions from the class. Ask students who they would like to make a story about and what information to include. Make the changes on screen.
