Making Summer Plans in Times of COVID

Many countries like Canada, Mexico, France, Greece, Spain, Sweden, and the UK are no longer requiring that fully vaccinated travellers (who have had two doses of the COVID vaccine) and under-18s take a COVID test before they travel. There will be no more mask-wearing indoors and COVID certificates will become a thing of the past. But are travellers willing to take the risk?

According to the European Travel Commission (ETC), the answer seems to be yes. 77 per cent of people have made travel plans between April and September 2022, with just over half hoping to visit another European country.



Peter Kern, CEO of Expedia group, thinks summer 2022 will be the busiest travel season ever. He explains that with Europe relaxing restrictions and borders reopening in places like Australia, travel will make a big comeback. Kern predicts that airlines will be back to historic levels by August. He thinks prices will be high, but people will be willing to pay whatever it takes to get away. People have been saving since 2020 and are eager to pay for experiences. "They want to go to New York and go to a Broadway show," he says, adding that cities in Europe with a cultural offer will also be popular destinations.

Kern is not the only one who thinks so. Ryanair's Michael O'Leary also predicts a strong bounce-back. Ryanair is recruiting and training 2,000 new cabin crew and 1,000 new pilots, while British Airways is looking to hire thousands of new staff.

It seems that with fewer COVID-related logistics to think about, summer plans can return to older more persistent questions like "the beach, city, or mountains?".
