- 1 "Blurb writing is a mini art form," Iris Murdoch once wrote. And like many other art forms, companies have been experimenting without artists.
- 2 A German company that sells digital book services to publishers has said it will use ChatGPT (a chatbot that uses internet data to answer questions) in its software.
- 3 Bookwire said publishers could try using ChatGPT for digital book marketing. This will only happen if a publisher agrees and the company is not responsible for the text created by ChatGPT.
- 4 This will probably make many people in the books industry angry. The Society of Authors warned in early 2023 that the industry needs to "protect copyright and creative careers from new technology".
- 5 I decided to test ChatGPT's "imagination" by asking it to write blurbs for some well-known titles. After experimenting with different instructions, here are some of the most exciting ones.
- 6 A blurb of a George Eliot classic:
- 7 *Middlemarch is the Real Housewives of 19th-century England. Follow the lives of the rich as they deal with love and gossip. This book has more drama than a season of Keeping Up With the Kardashians.*
- 8 A blurb of an Old English poem written for Gen Z:
- 9 *Yo, have you checked out Beowulf? This dude's a complete animal, killing monsters like it's NBD [no big deal]. His adventures are full of battles that shock you. Trust me, you won't want to miss it.*
- 10 A blurb for the Bible for those looking for their next self-help read:
- 11 *The guide to life, love and being saved! It's got enough drama to compete with Game of Thrones. Laugh, cry and be amazed at the stories of Adam and Eve, Noah, and Jesus and his miracles. Don't miss out on this divine masterpiece!*
- 12 A tweet promoting an Irish classic:
- 13 *OH MY GOSH, have you read Ulysses?! It's the most impressive masterpiece I've ever read! You won't believe it! #Ulysses #JamesJoyce #MindBlowing #LiteraryGenius #LifeChanging*
- 14 ChatGPT writes blurbs that are almost good enough when you give it the right instructions. Book descriptions are generally correct. But there are problems: the blurbs are full of clichés – every book is a "masterpiece". So don't worry, blurbers and reviewers – we still need you (at least for now).
