- 1 Elon Musk bought Twitter last October. Even though everything I hate is there, so is a lot of what I love. My father never had a TV because he said every time you thought you were good at something – cooking, being alive – on the TV, there was someone better at it than you. I thought that was the whole point: the more people who can do it, the better. Also, I really wanted a TV.
- 2 Soon after Musk bought Twitter, more of what I hated was there. Donald Trump was let back on, and you had to pay for blue ticks. Some staff quit, and some were fired. The new owner did surprising things: walking into the office with a sink, using a poo emoji to answer journalists. One man could get the whole world to have the wrong conversation.
- 3 And Twitter wasn't good for users. There were long conversations I wasn't interested in, prejudice and unpleasant comments on my timeline. How could this be made "for me" when I blocked it years ago?
- 4 My direct messages were full of pretty avatars trying to sell a new scam. A young woman who wants to sell crypto but has just broken up with her boyfriend and is drunk.
- 5 As other options appeared, the question moved on: Mastodon has the right politics. It can never be bought, is democratically moderated, and is also nothing like horrible enough. However, it does not have as much content and is sometimes repetitive.
- 6 Threads, Mark Zuckerberg's network tied to Instagram, was better because it had more money. It was also part of an existing platform, and many of Twitter's ex-employees went to work there. Very soon, it had 100 million users.
- 7 These platforms make me ask some questions: What makes Wikipedia Wikipedia – an amazing example of human cooperation and knowledge – and Facebook Facebook – a place where people make each other crazy? What is it about money, the way they are run, that creates such different experiences from the same things: people participating? Is it as simple as money, and if so, why aren't all non-profit platforms better?

- 8 In one way, Musk taught us how one ego can destroy things, but we must find a solution that is better than "stop using Twitter and find a hobby".
