Did you know...?


Halloween is celebrated on October 31st. Many people, both children and adults, dress up in costumes for Halloween. The costumes can be scary, funny, weird, or pretty. Some people like to dress up as famous characters from books or TV shows.

In the evening, **(1) children go trick-or-treating** in their costumes. They visit people's houses asking for candy. Some children get *a lot* of candy on Halloween!

There are also parties on Halloween. Many adults have costumes parties where they (2) tell scary stories and play games. Children have Halloween parties, too. Some children (3) go bobbing for apples and eat snacks and candy.

Another tradition is to **(4) make jack-o-lanterns**. People draw faces on pumpkins. Then they cut the pumpkin to make holes. Sometimes, the jack-o-lanterns have lights inside.

Many people also like to **(5) decorate their houses for Halloween**. They hang decorations like spiders and cobwebs, pumpkins, or scary characters outside their houses. People see the decorations when they go trick-or-treating.
