People to be able to move across land border with no checks, and airport to have Eurostar-style dual border checks

- 1 The UK and Spain have made an important new deal about Gibraltar. This ends a long disagreement about what happens after Brexit. The deal makes it easier for people and goods to move between Spain and Gibraltar.
- 2 There will be new passport checks at Gibraltar's airport, like the ones used in Eurostar stations, but people and goods crossing the land border will not be checked anymore.
- This deal does not change who controls Gibraltar. It is still British. But British people who are not living in Gibraltar must follow Schengen rules. They can only stay in the Schengen area for 90 days in a 180-day period. If they stay longer than 90 days, they may not be allowed to enter. Spanish officers will decide who can enter Gibraltar under Schengen rules.
- 4 UK Foreign Secretary David Lammy said this is a good and useful deal after many years of uncertainty. Spanish Foreign Minister José Manuel Albares and Gibraltar's leader Fabian Picardo called this deal a "historic agreement."

- 5 Every day, about 15,000 people cross the border, including many workers who live in Spain but work in Gibraltar. Now, people living in Gibraltar can use residence cards, and Spanish citizens can use ID cards to cross. The deal helps to stop a "hard border" that the EU could have created.
- 6 At a meeting in Brussels, Albares said this agreement is a new beginning between Spain and the UK. "The border will disappear. We will have free movement of people and goods," he said.
- 7 UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer called Gibraltar's leader to say congratulations. They agreed this was a big step for better relations between the UK and Spain. This agreement might create more financial opportunities for the two countries.
- 8 Gibraltar is a British territory in southern Spain. It has been British since 1713 but is self-governing in most areas. In 2002, 99 per cent of people in Gibraltar voted to stay British and not share control with Spain.
