#### The prosecution: Claire

- 1 Before Xavier moved into my flat, I said we could live together, but that he needed to find somewhere else to work. I asked him to do this to help us have a good relationship.
- 2 My job is 90 per cent phone calls, so Xavier had to leave. Luckily, we are good **flatmates**, but I like to have different spaces for work, sleep and **socialising**. Xavier doesn't think like that. He can get up, start work and then leave the house.
- 3 It took Xavier a while to find a **co-working space**. Before that, he was hanging around at home, and it was **annoying**.
- 4 I like to talk about things that come up, but Xavier **avoids** things. But I think it's important to stick to a **routine**. It's important to have **separation** as a couple.

#### The defence: Xavier

- 5 I've never been to a co-working space; I always worked at home. I work better that way. I wake up, have a coffee and start work. I like starting early and finishing by 2 or 3pm, and having my own place to work.
- 6 Claire starts at 1pm, so I thought: great, I'll work in our flat until she needs the office, and pop into a co-working space sometimes. But then, after about 10 days, she said it wasn't working, that she wanted me to work outside of the flat all the time.
- 7 Claire said she wanted her space in the mornings. She doesn't talk much, but I am a morning person. I didn't like having to find a co-working space. I needed to work out what I liked and what I wanted out of one.
- 8 In some ways, working at the co-working space makes our lives more interesting, because I come home with news about my day. But sometimes I wish I had a bit more **freedom** to be in the flat because it's my home, too.
